SESSION INFORMATION

Swallow Physiology Connections

Understanding swallow physiology goes beyond just knowing nerves and muscles, it impacts how we see a person's swallow and the decisions that follow. Lingual movement, airway protection and bolus clearance are just a few physiologically-based behaviors we interpret and make clinical decisions with. This impacts our patients and their quality of life (QOL). The evidence available on these behaviors must guide our interpretation. This session will focus on such physiologically-based decision-making, as well as present data on changes in persons with dementia and changes when in the presence of a pill. The general aim of the presentation will be clinical.

IDDSI Framework in Practice

The International Dysphagia Diet Standardisation Initiative (IDDSI) framework was released in December 2015 to overwhelming international support, including a joint announcement in January 2017 from ASHA and the American Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. Implementation is underway in many parts of the world. This practical session will provide an interactive opportunity to learn more about the development and evidence behind the framework and to use the IDDSI food and drink testing methods in practice. In addition, lessons learned on the implementation process will be shared by two speakers. The IDDSI Functional Diet Scale will also be presented.
