Description	<p>The Department of Speech, Language, and Hearing Sciences at Purdue University, West Lafayette, IN is seeking applications for an assistant or associate level tenure-track faculty position in Speech Physiology. Primary criteria are excellence in research and in teaching. A PhD in Speech Science or a related field is required. Essential duties include teaching at the undergraduate and graduate level.
