Matt Hay was a sophomore in college when he found out he was going to lose his hearing. He coasted through the early years of his diagnosis in denial, but as his hearing aids got bigger and bigger, Matt realized he wanted to

capture the sounds that were slipping away. He started listening to music with a new appreciation, truly studying it, as he curates the soundtrack for the rest of his life. Behind each song, there is a coming-of-age story about freedom, tragedy and falling in love. When Matt's hearing eventually faded to nothing, the silent soundtrack in his head takes on a role he never imagines. He shares his message in hopes to keep someone from ever feeling as lost, helpless and alone as he did the day he woke up deaf ... the day sound became only a memory.

Bridging the Gap: Integrating Mental Health and Well-Being Into Patient Care to Optimize Holistic and Inclusive Practices in CSD

Providing comprehensive, holistic care that is inclusive and responsive to the needs of the individual is the obligation of every professional within the field of communication sciences and disorders (CSD). As our disciplines embrace diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) as core principles, it is essential that we consistently evaluate our practice patterns to ensure the equitable implementation of inclusive

practices. This session will concentrate on the integration of mental health and well-being into patient care by elucidating mental health and well-being as a DEI construct and providing an overview of the intersectionality of mental health and well-being within CSD. Lastly, practical strategies for integrating mental health and well-being into clinical practice will be addressed.

Between Sound Judgment and Silence: Navigating Ethical Grey Areas in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology

Professionals in speech-language pathology and audiology often face complex ethical dilemmas that challenge their judgment and responsibility to clients, institutions and the public. This session explores the intricate ethical decision-making process, especially within the grey areas where right and wrong are not always clear-cut. We will examine ethical principles, focusing on the balance between

professional duties and real-world pressures, and delve into the legal implications associated with these decisions. Topics will include the impact of licensure requirements, the potential consequences of ethical missteps and the risks involved in not adhering to best practices. Additionally, we will outline practical methods for registering a complaint, including how to navigate regulatory bodies and professional associations.
